LEGISLATIVE BILL 1284A

FINAL READING

Introduced by Walz, 15.

Read first time March 25, 2024

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to appropriations; to transfer and appropriate
- 2 funds to aid in carrying out the provisions of Legislative Bill
- 3 1284, One Hundred Eighth Legislature, Second Session, 2024; and to
- 4 declare an emergency.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. The State Treasurer shall transfer \$1,000,000 from the
2 Education Future Fund to the Computer Science and Technology Education
3 Fund on or before June 30, 2025, on such dates and in such amounts as
4 directed by the budget administrator of the budget division of the
5 Department of Administrative Services.

6 Sec. 2. The State Treasurer shall transfer \$500,000 from the
7 Education Future Fund to the Computer Science and Technology Education
8 Fund upon notification by the State Department of Education to the State
9 Treasurer that private matching funds have been received, on or before
10 June 30, 2025, on such dates and in such amounts as directed by the
11 budget administrator of the budget division of the Department of
12 Administrative Services.

13 Sec. 3. There is hereby appropriated (1) \$148,487 from the General
14 Fund and \$1,500,000 from the Computer Science and Technology Education
15 Fund and \$148,533 from the Education Future Fund for FY2024-25 and (2)
16 \$80,358 from the General Fund and \$1,500,000 from the Computer Science
17 and Technology Education Fund and \$398,533 from the Education Future Fund
18 for FY2025-26 to the State Department of Education, for Program 25, to
19 aid in carrying out the provisions of Legislative Bill 1284, One Hundred
20 Eighth Legislature, Second Session, 2024.

21 There is included in the appropriation to this program for FY2024-25
22 \$-0- Cash Funds for a pilot program to make menstrual products available
23 to each school district. There is included in the appropriation to this
24 program for FY2025-26 \$250,000 Cash Funds for a pilot program to make
25 menstrual products available to each school district.

26 Total expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per
27 diems from funds appropriated in this section shall not exceed \$115,915
28 for FY2024-25 or \$74,784 for FY2025-26.

29 Sec. 4. There is hereby appropriated (1) \$2,351,467 from the
30 Education Future Fund for FY2024-25 and (2) \$1,851,467 from the Education
31 Future Fund for FY2025-26 to the State Department of Education, for

1 Program 158, to aid in carrying out the provisions of Legislative Bill
2 1284, One Hundred Eighth Legislature, Second Session, 2024.

3 There is included in the appropriation to this program for FY2024-25
4 \$2,351,467 Cash Funds for state aid, which shall only be used for such
5 purpose. There is included in the appropriation to this program for
6 FY2025-26 \$1,851,467 Cash Funds for state aid, which shall only be used
7 for such purpose.

8 There is included in the amount shown as aid for this program for
9 FY2024-25 \$1,851,467 Cash Funds for aid to educational service units to
10 provide regional coaches and job-embedded training relating to evidence-
11 based reading instruction. There is included in the amount shown as aid
12 for this program for FY2025-26 \$1,851,467 Cash Funds for aid to
13 educational service units to provide regional coaches and job-embedded
14 training relating to evidence-based reading instruction.

15 There is included in the amount shown as aid for this program for
16 FY2024-25 \$500,000 Cash Funds for grants awarded under the Dyslexia
17 Research Grant Program. There is included in the amount shown as aid for
18 this program for FY2025-26 \$-0- Cash Funds for grants awarded under the
19 Dyslexia Research Grant Program.

20 No expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems
21 for state employees shall be made from funds appropriated in this
22 section.

23 Sec. 5. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
24 passed and approved according to law.
