Summary of purpose and/or changes:

The purpose of LB 202 is to require that any joint entity or joint public agency's governing board consist of elected officials if that entity has the ability to place a lien on property for nonpayment of debt.

Section 1 Adds the appropriate citation.

Section 2 Prior to a joint entity or joint public agency created under the Interlocal Cooperative Act or Integrated Solid Waste Management Act exercises its authority to place a lien on real property, its governing board must consist of elected officials.

Section 3 Repealer.

Explanation of amendments, if any:

The committee amendment clarifies that a lien may be placed on “real” property and that the boards must be comprised of elected officials only.

This is a clarifying amendment and does not change the purposes for which the bill was introduced.
