Summary of purpose and/or changes: Legislative Bill 424 proposes to amend section 28-419, which currently prohibits persons from inducing or enticing another to breathe, inhale, or drink any compound containing one or more listed ingredients for the purpose of inducing a condition of intoxication, to remove the induce or entice element from the offense and have the crime apply directly to the person breathing, inhaling or drinking the compound. Section 28-423 already prohibits anyone from inducing or enticing anyone to violate section 28-419 so the proposed change would not remove any potential liability from those who induce or entice but would add a prohibition on the use of such substances for the purpose of intoxication. A

violation of this section is a Class III misdemeanor, punishable with up to 3 months in jail and a \$500 fine.
