# Floor Debate January 09, 2008

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#### PRESIDENT SHEEHY PRESIDING []

PRESIDENT SHEEHY: Good morning. Welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber for the first day of the One Hundredth Legislature, Second Session. Our chaplain for today is Senator Kruse. Would you all please rise. []

SENATOR KRUSE: (Prayer offered.) []

PRESIDENT SHEEHY: Thank you, Senator Kruse. If you would all still remain standing, we will now have the Presentation of Colors by the Nebraska Army and Air National Guard. []

#### PRESENTATION OF COLORS []

PRESIDENT SHEEHY: Thank you to the members of our Nebraska Army and Air National Guard. Pursuant to the provisions of Article III, Section 10 of the Constitution of Nebraska, the One Hundredth Legislature, Second Session of the Legislature of Nebraska, assembled in George W. Norris Legislative Chamber of the State Capitol at the hour of 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, January 9, 2008, is now called to order. Will senators please record your presence. Please record, Mr. Clerk. []

CLERK: (Roll read, Legislative Journal page 61.) I have a quorum present, Mr. President. []

PRESIDENT SHEEHY: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. The Chair recognizes Senator Hudkins. []

SENATOR HUDKINS: Thank you, Mr. President. I move that the rules, as now in our possession, be adopted until such time as the permanent rules are adopted, pursuant to Rule 2, Section 1, provided that the temporary rules shall not continue after the tenth legislative day. []

PRESIDENT SHEEHY: Thank you, Senator Hudkins. The motion before you is the adoption of temporary rules. All those in favor say aye. All those opposed say nay. The motion is adopted. Mr. Clerk, any letters of resignation or appointment letters? []

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CLERK: Mr. President, I do. I have a letter of resignation from Senator Mick Mines regarding his termination of service and submission of resignation effective October 31, 2007. Pursuant to that communication, Mr. President, I received a communication from the Governor appointing Mr. Scott Lautenbaugh to fill the vacancy in District 18 created by the resignation of Senator Mines. Pursuant to that appointment, I have an appointment letter from the Governor, oath of office as attested and signed by Senator Lautenbaugh, and other appropriate paperwork. PRESIDENT SHEEHY: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Do you have messages, reports, or announcements? []

Norris Day. And, Mr. President, finally this morning I have a series of proposed rules changes, several from Senator Hudkins, as Chair of the Rules Committee; also a proposed rules change from Senator Erdman. All of those will be referred to the Rules Committee for purposes of public hearing. And that's all that I have at this time, Mr. President. (Legislative Journal pages 65-105.) []

PRESIDENT SHEEHY: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. The Chair now recognizes Speaker Flood. []

SPEAKER FLOOD: Thank you very much, Mr. President, members. First of all, would like to welcome everybody back to the 2008 Legislative Session. We'd especially like to welcome Senator Lautenbaugh who is here with us today for his first day in the Legislature, legislative session. We welcome you to the Legislature. (Applause) Would also ask that you keep Senator Harms in your thoughts and prayers as he will be joining us later in the month and we wish him and his family all the best as he continues to recover. As far as this morning, I just wanted to share with you some thoughts about our schedule. I know that I dropped a memo off, but also for the benefit of citizens and those watching today, tomorrow we will begin at 10:00 a.m. We'll go to 12:30 or sooner,

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depending on the number of bills that are introduced tomorrow and the time it takes the Clerk's Office to process those bills. On Friday we will begin at 9:00 in the morning. It's my intention to debate the 2008 Session permanent rules. We'll adjourn before lunch if the rules are done. If the rules aren't done, we'll come back at 1:30 and we'll finish them off in the afternoon. Next week and the first day of each work week, we will start at 10:00 in the morning. If Monday is a recess day, then Tuesday we'll start at 10:00 a.m. for the rest of the session, unless otherwise you are notified. Next week we will begin a full day of debate every day except January 18 because next Friday, a week from this Friday, I plan to adjourn around noon. Half days begin with committee hearings on the 22nd. And briefly, with regard to priority bills, we're going to begin accepting those tomorrow. We could begin debating priorities as early as next week. I want to reassure you, though, the order in which you file your priority doesn't necessarily mean that you're going to have your bill immediately up. So if you have a bill that's in committee, you're not sure if it's going to come out, there's no benefit to you to prioritize it just to get it in early. There's absolutely no benefit. And with that, I just appreciate your attention and look forward to a good session. Welcome back. []
