Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 764 was introduced to provide the natural resources districts with a tool for water resources management through use of an integrated management plan.

Section 1 amends 46-715, relating to the development of integrated management plans (IMPs), by allowing a natural resources district to partner with the Department of Natural Resources to develop an IMP if its area has not be declared fully or overappropriated. A district is to notify the department on or before October 1 if it intends to develop an IMP with an objective of maintaining the status of not fully appropriated. If an IMP is developed under this section and the department subsequently determines its area to be fully appropriated, the district and department may amend the IMP.

Section 2 amends 46-717, relating to the type of information that is to be used to develop an IMP, by adding that IMPs developed according to the provisions of this bill must involve the district and department consulting with any party that relies on water from the affected river basin, subbasin or reach.
