## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 160 outright repeals Section 76-1517 which assigns a duty to county assessors to annually forward to the Secretary of State the name and address of every trust owning agricultural land within the county based on assessment rolls. Harmonizing revisions are made to Sections 76-1507 and 76-1516 to correct internal references accordingly.

The bill further amends Section 76-1523 to strike a related duty of the Secretary of State to utilize the reports of trust holdings to assist in identification of trusts engaged in farming and ranching as defined by Article XII, Section 8 of the state constitution (popularly referred to as the I-300 corporate farming restrictions). Revisions to this section also include a revisers amendment, unrelated to the primary purposes of the bill, to clarify disposition of fines assessed for failure of corporate trustees to file a report required by Section 76-1520.
