**Summary of purpose and/or changes:**

LB 699 changes boundaries of the Supreme Court judicial districts by the adoption of maps by reference.

The state is divided into six Supreme Court judicial districts. The overall range of deviation is approximately 2 percent. Districts are drawn using census geography and population data from the 2010 US Census.

The maps will be kept on file in the Secretary of State's office.

The bill includes an emergency clause.
