Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Legislative Bill 467 would amend the Postsecondary Institution Act to allow interstate reciprocity agreements regarding postsecondary distance education and allow fees for applications to modify recurrent authorizations to operate. The Postsecondary Institution Act provides for the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education to authorize postsecondary institutions to operate in Nebraska.

Section 85-2405 would be amended to allow the Commission to enter into interstate reciprocity agreements regarding postsecondary distance education. The Commission would also administer such agreements, approve or disapprove applications from Nebraska postsecondary institutions to participate, establish fees for such applications, and accept or reject authorizations granted by other states pursuant to such agreements.

Additional authorization would also be given to the Commission to establish fees for applications to modify a recurrent authorization to operate. The authority already exists to establish fees for applications for initial recurrent authorizations to operate and for renewals. A recurrent authorization to operate allows a postsecondary institution to operate in Nebraska if the institution has not yet qualified for an authorization to operate on a continuing basis.
