2	Act; to amend section 85-2105, Revised Statutes
3	Cumulative Supplement, 2012; to change requirements
4	relating to application submission; to harmonize
5	provisions; and to repeal the original section.

Section 1. Section 85-2105, Revised Statutes Cumulative
Supplement, 2012, is amended to read:

3 85-2105 (1) An applicant for the Access College Early Scholarship Program shall complete an application form developed and 4 5 provided by the commission and shall forward submit the form to his 6 or her guidance counselor or other official designated by the school. 7 Such application shall include, but not be limited to, the 8 applicant's high school, social security number, date of birth, grade point average, grade level, qualified postsecondary educational 9 institution, and information necessary to determine the student's 10 eligibility. The guidance counselor or other official designated by 11 12 the school shall verify the student's eligibility under the Access 13 College Early Scholarship Program Act and shall forward the application to the commission for review within fifteen days 14 following receipt of the form from the student. Notification of 15 tuition and mandatory fees to be accrued by the student shall be 16 provided to the commission by the student, high school, or qualified 17 18 postsecondary educational institution as determined by the commission. 19

20 (2) The commission shall review the application and 21 verify the student's eligibility under the act. The commission shall 22 notify the student and the student's guidance counselor <u>or other</u> 23 <u>official designated by the school</u> of the verification of eligibility 24 and the estimated award amount in writing within thirty days 25 following receipt of the form from the student's guidance counselor

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or other official designated by the school. The scholarship award 1 2 shall equal the lesser of tuition and mandatory fees accrued by the 3 student after any discounts applicable to such student from the qualified postsecondary educational institution or the tuition and 4 5 mandatory fees that would have been accrued by the student for the same number of credit hours if the student were taking the course as 6 7 a full-time, resident, undergraduate student from the University of 8 Nebraska-Lincoln. The commission shall forward such amount directly 9 to the qualified postsecondary educational institution as payment of 10 such student's tuition and mandatory fees.

(3) The commission shall make such payments in the order the applications are received, except that the commission may limit the number of scholarships awarded in each term.

14 (4) The commission may limit the number of scholarships a15 student may receive.

16 (5) For any student receiving a scholarship pursuant to the act for tuition and mandatory fees, the qualified postsecondary 17 18 educational institution receiving the payment shall report either the 19 student's grade for the course or the student's failure to complete 20 the course to the commission within thirty days after the end of the course or within one hundred eighty days after receipt of a payment 21 pursuant to the act if the course for which the scholarship was 22 23 awarded does not have a specified ending date. The commission shall keep the identity of students receiving scholarships confidential, 24 25 except as necessary to comply with the requirements of the act.
