## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 874 amends section 32-570 to harmonize the process for filling vacancies on school boards. Per the current requirements of Neb. Rev. Stat. section 32-570, if a vacancy occurs in the membership of a school board, the term of the appointee varies between the next primary election and elected at the following general election or until the unexpired term depending on the class of the school board. The term length is determined by what date the position becomes vacant. The bill will adopt the current Class V process for all school board classes, changing appointments to fill a vacancy on a school board to be for the remainder of the unexpired term.

## **Explanation of amendments:**

AM 2385 amends LB 874 to serve as the election omnibus bill. It does not substantively change the original provisions of LB 874, but includes the following bills:

LB 879 amends section 32-618 to change the signature requirement to place a candidate's name on the partisan ballot for the general election by petition to at least 10 percent of the registered voters entitled to vote for the office.

LB 682 has two substantive provisions. First, it changes the deadline for a voter to request a ballot to vote by mail from 4 p.m. on the Wednesday preceding the election to the close of business on the second Friday preceding the election. The 'close of business' language was not included in the original bill. Second, it changes the earliest day an election commissioner or county clerk can send out vote by mail ballots from the 20th day before the election to the 22nd day before the election.
