- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to elections; to amend section 32-949.01,
- 2 Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2014, and sections 32-941,
- 3 32-947, and 32-953, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2015; to change
- 4 deadlines for ballots for early voting and special elections by
- 5 mail; to provide an operative date; to repeal the original sections;
- 6 and to declare an emergency.
- 7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 32-941, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2015, is

2 amended to read:

3 32-941 Any registered voter permitted to vote early pursuant to section 32-938 may, not more than one hundred twenty days before any 4 election and not later than the second Friday 4 p.m. on the Wednesday 5 preceding the election, request a ballot for the election to be mailed to 6 7 a specific address. A registered voter shall request a ballot in writing to the election commissioner or county clerk in the county where the 8 registered voter has established his or her home and shall indicate his 9 or her residence address, the address to which the ballot is to be mailed 10 if different, and his or her telephone number if available. The 11 registered voter may use the form published by the election commissioner 12 or county clerk pursuant to section 32-808. The registered voter shall 13 sign the request. A registered voter may use a facsimile machine or 14 electronic mail for the submission of a request for a ballot. The 15 16 election commissioner or county clerk shall include a registration 17 application with the ballots if the person is not registered. Registration applications shall not be mailed after the third Friday 18 preceding the election. If the person is not registered to vote, the 19 registration application shall be returned not later than the closing of 20 the polls on the day of the election. No ballot issued under this section 21 shall be counted unless such registration application is properly 22 23 completed and processed.

Sec. 2. Section 32-947, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2015, is amended to read:

32-947 (1) Upon receipt of an application or other request for a ballot to vote early, the election commissioner or county clerk shall determine whether the applicant is a registered voter and is entitled to vote as requested. If the election commissioner or county clerk determines that the applicant is a registered voter entitled to vote early and the application was received not later than the second Friday

- 1 at or before 4 p.m. on the Wednesday preceding the election, the election
- 2 commissioner or county clerk shall deliver a ballot to the applicant in
- 3 person or by mail, postage paid. The election commissioner or county
- 4 clerk or any employee of the election commissioner or county clerk shall
- 5 write or cause to be affixed his or her customary signature or initials
- 6 on the ballot.
- 7 (2) An unsealed identification envelope shall be delivered with the
- 8 ballot, and upon the back of the envelope shall be printed a form
- 9 substantially as follows:
- 10 VOTER'S OATH
- 11 I, the undersigned voter, declare that the enclosed ballot or
- 12 ballots contained no voting marks of any kind when I received them, and I
- 13 caused the ballot or ballots to be marked, enclosed in the identification
- 14 envelope, and sealed in such envelope.
- To the best of my knowledge and belief, I declare under penalty of
- 16 election falsification that:
- 17 (a) I,, am a registered voter
- 18 in County;
- 19 (b) I reside in the State of Nebraska at;
- 20 (c) I have voted the enclosed ballot and am returning it in
- 21 compliance with Nebraska law; and
- 22 (d) I have not voted and will not vote in this election except by
- 23 this ballot.
- 24 ANY PERSON WHO SIGNS THIS FORM KNOWING THAT ANY OF THE INFORMATION
- 25 IN THE FORM IS FALSE SHALL BE GUILTY OF ELECTION FALSIFICATION, A CLASS
- 26 IV FELONY UNDER SECTION 32-1502 OF THE STATUTES OF NEBRASKA. THE PENALTY
- 27 FOR ELECTION FALSIFICATION IS IMPRISONMENT FOR UP TO FIVE YEARS OR A FINE
- 28 NOT TO EXCEED TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS, OR BOTH.
- 29 I also understand that failure to sign below will invalidate my
- 30 ballot.
- 31 Signature

- 1 (3) If the ballot and identification envelope will be returned by 2 mail or by someone other than the voter, the election commissioner or
- 3 county clerk shall include with the ballot an identification envelope
- 4 upon the face of which shall be printed the official title and post
- 5 office address of the election commissioner or county clerk.
- 6 (4) The election commissioner or county clerk shall also enclose 7 with the ballot materials:
- 8 (a) A registration application, if the election commissioner or 9 county clerk has determined that the applicant is not a registered voter 10 pursuant to section 32-945, with instructions that failure to return the 11 completed and signed application indicating the residence address as it 12 appears on the voter's request for a ballot to the election commissioner 13 or county clerk by the close of the polls on election day will result in
- 14 the ballot not being counted;
- (b) A registration application and the oath pursuant to section 15 16 32-946, if the voter is without a residence address, with instructions that the residence address of the voter shall be deemed that of the 17 office of the election commissioner or county clerk of the county of the 18 voter's prior residence and that failure to return the completed and 19 signed application and oath to the election commissioner or county clerk 20 by the close of the polls on election day will result in the ballot not 21 22 being counted; or
- (c) Written instructions directing the voter to submit a copy of an identification document pursuant to section 32-318.01 if the voter is required to present identification under such section and advising the voter that failure to submit identification to the election commissioner or county clerk by the close of the polls on election day will result in the ballot not being counted.
- (5) The election commissioner or county clerk may enclose with the ballot materials a separate return envelope for the voter's use in returning his or her identification envelope containing the voted ballot,

- 1 registration application, and other materials that may be required.
- Sec. 3. Section 32-949.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 3 2014, is amended to read:
- 4 32-949.01 If a ballot for early voting is destroyed, spoiled, lost,
- 5 or not received by the registered voter, the voter may cast a provisional
- 6 ballot pursuant to section 32-915 at the voter's polling place on
- 7 election day or may obtain a replacement ballot from the election
- 8 commissioner or county clerk by signing a statement verified on oath or
- 9 affirmation on a form prescribed by the Secretary of State that the
- 10 original ballot for early voting was destroyed, spoiled, lost, or not
- 11 received and delivering the statement to the election commissioner or
- 12 county clerk. To receive a replacement ballot in person, the voter shall
- 13 return the statement to the office of the election commissioner or county
- 14 clerk by 8 p.m. on the day of the election. To receive a replacement
- 15 ballot by mail, the voter shall return the statement to such office prior
- 16 to the close of business on the <u>second Friday preceding fourth business</u>
- 17 day before the election. If the election commissioner or county clerk
- 18 receives a statement meeting the requirements of this section, he or she
- 19 shall deliver a replacement ballot to the voter if the voter is present
- 20 in the office or shall mail a replacement ballot to the voter at the
- 21 address shown on the statement. The election commissioner or county clerk
- 22 shall keep a record of all replacement ballots issued under this section.
- 23 Sec. 4. Section 32-953, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2015, is
- 24 amended to read:
- 25 32-953 (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2) of this
- 26 section, the election commissioner or county clerk shall mail the
- 27 official ballot to all registered voters of the political subdivision or
- 28 the district or ward of the political subdivision at the addresses
- 29 appearing on the voter registration register on the same day. The ballots
- 30 shall be mailed by nonforwardable first-class mail not sooner than the
- 31 twenty-second twentieth day before the date set for the election and not

- 1 later than the tenth day before the date set for the election. The
- 2 election commissioner or county clerk shall include with the ballot an
- 3 unsealed identification envelope meeting the requirements of subsection
- 4 (2) of section 32-947 and instructions sufficient to describe the voting
- 5 process.
- 6 (2) The election commissioner or county clerk may choose not to mail
- 7 a ballot to all registered voters who have been sent a notice pursuant to
- 8 section 32-329 and failed to respond to the notice. If the election
- 9 commissioner or county clerk chooses not to mail a ballot to such voters,
- 10 he or she shall mail a notice to all such registered voters explaining
- 11 how to obtain a ballot and stating the applicable deadlines.
- 12 Sec. 5. This act becomes operative on June 1, 2016.
- 13 Sec. 6. Original section 32-949.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 14 Supplement, 2014, and sections 32-941, 32-947, and 32-953, Revised
- 15 Statutes Supplement, 2015, are repealed.
- 16 Sec. 7. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
- 17 passed and approved according to law.
