Nebraska Elemental Formula Reimbursement Program Annual Report November 2021

The Nebraska Elemental Formula Reimbursement Program was created by Nebraska Revised Statute 68-158*, with the operative date of July 1, 2014. This report covers the seventh full year of implementation, from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021. Activities conducted during this time period include:

- 1. Completed the Nebraska Elemental Reimbursement Program website to clearly define the parameters of the program for the public.
- 2. Served 77 individuals, which is an 8 percent increase from SFY 19-20, and expended \$57,892.18 in formula reimbursement costs, which is a 28 percent decrease from the prior year.

*Nebraska Revised Statute 68-158

The Department of Health and Human Services shall establish a program to provide amino acidbased elemental formulas for the diagnosis and treatment of Immunoglobulin E and non-Immunoglobulin E mediated allergies to multiple food proteins, food-protein-induced enterocolitis syndrome, eosinophilic disorders, and impaired absorption of nutrients caused by disorders affecting the absorptive surface, functional length, and motility of the gastrointestinal tract, when the ordering physician has issued a written order stating that the amino acid-based elemental formula is medically necessary for the treatment of a disease or disorder. Up to fifty percent of the actual out-of-pocket cost, not to exceed twelve thousand dollars, for amino acidbased elemental formulas shall be available to an individual without fees each twelve-month period. The department shall distribute funds on a first-come, first-served basis. Nothing in this section is deemed to be an entitlement. The maximum total General Fund expenditures per year for amino acid-based elemental formulas shall not exceed two hundred fifty thousand dollars each fiscal year in FY2014-15 and FY2015-16. The Department of Health and Human Services shall provide an electronic report on the program to the Legislature annually on or before December 15 of each year.
