- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to child labor laws; to amend sections 48-311
- 2 and 48-312, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change
- 3 penalties; to provide enforcement powers for the Department of
- 4 Labor; and to repeal the original sections.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 48-311, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is

- 2 amended to read:
- 3 48-311 Whoever employs a child under sixteen years of age and
- 4 whoever, having under his or her control a child under such age, causes
- 5 or permits such child to be employed in violation of sections 48-302 to
- 6 48-313 is guilty of a Class  $\underline{I}$   $\overline{II}$  misdemeanor. Whoever continues to employ
- 7 any child in violation of any of such sections, after being notified by
- 8 an attendance officer or by the Department of Labor or by its assistants
- 9 or employees, is, for every day thereafter that such employment
- 10 continues, guilty of a Class I H misdemeanor.
- 11 The failure of an employer of child labor to produce, upon request
- of a person authorized to demand the same, any employment certificate or
- 13 list required by such sections shall be prima facie evidence of the
- 14 illegal employment of any child whose employment certificate is not
- 15 produced or whose name is not listed. Any corporation or employer
- 16 retaining employment certificates in violation of such sections is guilty
- 17 of a Class I H misdemeanor.
- 18 Every person authorized or required to sign any certificate or
- 19 statement prescribed by such sections who knowingly certifies or makes
- 20 oath to any material false statement therein or who violates any of the
- 21 provisions of such sections is guilty of a Class  $\underline{I}$   $\underline{II}$  misdemeanor.
- 22 Every person who refuses admittance to any person authorized to
- 23 visit or inspect any premises or place of business under the provisions
- 24 of such sections and to produce all certificates and lists he or she may
- 25 have when demanded, after such person shall have announced his or her
- 26 name and the office he or she holds and the purpose of his or her visit,
- 27 or otherwise obstructs such persons in the performance of their duties
- 28 prescribed by such sections is guilty of a Class  $\underline{I}$   $\underline{II}$  misdemeanor.
- 29 Sec. 2. Section 48-312, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 30 amended to read:
- 31 48-312 The presence of a child under sixteen years of age,

- 1 apparently at work, in a place of employment as defined in section 48-301
- 2 is prima facie evidence of his or her employment there. The Department of
- 3 <u>Labor</u>, any agent or employee of the department, or any attendance officer
- 4 <u>may</u> Attendance officers shall visit the places of employment to ascertain
- 5 whether any children are employed contrary to the provisions of sections
- 6 48-302 to 48-313, and <u>such</u> the attendance <u>officer</u> officers shall report
- 7 any cases of illegal employment to the <u>department</u> Department of Labor and
- 8 to the county attorney. The Commissioner of Labor may subpoena records
- 9 from any employer suspected of violating sections 48-302 to 48-313.
- 10 Sec. 3. Original sections 48-311 and 48-312, Reissue Revised
- 11 Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.
