SENATOR DICKINSON: I am still asking--reiterating that question of a little bit ago. In the opinion of the chair, is it proper to ask this Legislature of the state of Nebraska to make a decision on an issue that is not published in our Journal, has never been circulated so that we can see it visibly, and to some of us has never been presented to--

PRESIDENT: That question is not proper, Senator. That's an argumentative question.

SENATOR DICKINSON: No it isn't. I don't consider it so at all, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: We are dealing with the suspension of the Rules not the ERA.

SENATOR DICKINSON: Ok. Ok. Very good. I retract what I asked, when is it proper for me to ask this question and for you to give an answer.

PRESIDENT: When we have argument on ERA, no. on suspension of the Rules. Record your votes. Have you recorded your votes? Mr. Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 23 nays, 4 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Motion to suspend the Rules fails. Senator Koch, do you wish to be recognized or is your light on. Senator Goodrich, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR GOODRICH: I move to adjourn until 10 o'clock Monday morning.

PRESIDENT: Mr. Speaker, do you have anything for us?

SENATOR BURBACH: No, thank you, sir. That's fine.

PRESIDENT: Is there a second to the motion to adjourn? For what purpose do you arise, Senator Marsh?

SENATOR MARSH: I move to advance LR 4 from General File to E & R Initial.

PRESIDENT: Only with the permission of the mover of the motion to adjourn. I am afraid we can't entertain that. There is a motion to adjourn. The question is shall we adjourn until 10 o'clock Monday. It will be a machine vote to save time. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 24 ayes, 21 nays, 4 not voting.

PRESIDENT: We are adjourned.
