SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'd like to move that the matter be set over until next Tuesday, whatever date that turns out to be. I would like to request of Senator Warner, first of all a question. Does the information you've provided, I haven't had an opportunity to go over it -- does it contain all the legal documentation for the position that the committee has taken, or is there additional supporting case law or other things that somebody interested in researching it might need?

PRESIDENT: There is a motion that this matter be set for next Tuesday. Senator Warner is recognized. Are you speaking on the DeCamp motion now sir?

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President I rise to respond to his question relative to the material that was distributed. If you wish to resolve the question when the debate should be set first, I will defer my answer.

PRESIDENT: Well, all I heard was a motion. You don't wish to speak to that motion? Senator Chambers, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'll wait until you dispose of that motion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman, I arise only to support . . . It's immaterial to me if it's on Tuesday or Wednesday. When it comes to casting my vote on this important issue I want to have all the information I can possibly get. The material that has been laid on our desk this morning -- I have not had time to read it. I do think it would be highly proper and advisable to delay action on this morning. I want to say that I support the motion to postpone the action on this particular issue until -- I think it's best by next Tuesday that would provide time. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers. Is there any further discussion? Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, I would like to amend the motion to Thursday if possible. Do you have objection to that Senator . . .

PRESIDENT: Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. Chairman, I probably better delay my motion. I was going to amend the motion and say Monday.

PRESIDENT: For what purpose do you arise Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Just to state that I would accept the amendment of Senator Duis and would hope that we wouldn't set it for Monday, for the reason that on Monday I hope to be doing some research and going over the things that are in the case. I think we all probably should look into it very carefully because we would be not living up to our responsibilities if we didn't. When I vote I want to have all the answers before me.
