CLERK: Mr. President, the motion we have is that Mr. Mahoney moved that the ballots and committee records be preserved and kept in the Secretary of State's office for 30 days. Motion pending.

PRESIDENT: The chair recognizes Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: I sent a motion up to the desk that would amend the Mahoney motion that the records and papers that are in the possession of the Select Committee on the 48th District would be--how did I say it Vince.

CLERK: He says I move that the records and the papers in the possession of the Select Committee on the 48th District be deposited with the Clerk of the Legislature for safe keeping. Signed Senator Warner.

PRESIDENT: Is there any discussion on the Warner motion-- substitute motion. All right, this is an amendment.

SENATOR WARNER: An amendment to Senator Mahoney's.

PRESIDENT: On the amendment to Senator Mahoney's motion. The question is shall the amendment to the Mahoney motion pass. Record your vote. Have you voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 42 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Now the question is shall the Mahoney motion pass as amended. Any discussion? Record your vote. Have you voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 42 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion as amended passes. We will not take up the Cavanaugh motion since the Senator is not here, and Senator Mahoney advises the chair that his other motion is withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, the other Mahoney motion is found on Page 273 of the Journal and he asks unanimous consent to withdraw.

PRESIDENT: Is there any objection to the withdrawal of the motion by Senator Mahoney? Seeing none, it is withdrawn. Unfinished business including messages on President's desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent to have my name added to LB 438. Senator Kime, signed.

PRESIDENT: The request is for unanimous consent by Senator Kime to be added to LB 48?

CLERK: Mr. President, it is a Committee bill so the motion would be in order. It's unanimous consent, yes.

PRESIDENT: Is there any objection? Seeing none, unanimous consent to add Senator Kime's name is given. The chair recognizes Senator Simpson. For what purpose, Senator?
