CLERK: 31 ayes, 3 nays, 15 not voting.

PRESIDENT: LB 130 is advanced as amended.

CLERK: Mr. President, that is all of General File. I have an opinion from the Attorney General's office which will be put out in full in the Legislative Journal. See Pages 333 and 334.

PRESIDENT: Other miscellaneous business, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, we have Committee Reports. Your committee on Constitutional Revision to whom was referred LB 17 instructs me to report the same to the Legislature the recommendation it be advanced to General File. Signed Senator Syas. Mr. President, your committee on Government to whom was referred LB 26 instructs me to report the same indefinitely postponed. LB 86, indefinitely postponed. LB 90, General File as amended. Signed Senator Rasmussen, Chairman. Mr. President, your committee on Urban Affairs gives notice of hearings set for March 12th. Signed Senator Fowler. Two notices from Senator Fowler's Urban Affairs Committee and also notice of Committee Hearings by Revenue. Signed Senator Cal Carsten, Chairman.

PRESIDENT: The chair recognizes the Speaker, the Honorable Senator Jules Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I have had placed on your desk--

PRESIDENT: Will the Legislature please be in order for the Speaker.

SENATOR BURBACH: I have had placed on your desk through a Page a three page paper which would offer the changes on a procedural basis on our floor. I give this to you. Take it home. Read it or read it at your leisure. Study it. On Tuesday morning, we will have a discussion on this procedural changes. Hopefully that you will buy the issue, adopt it. I will be asking and I am going over to ask the chairman of the Rules Committee now for consideration of possibly two rule changes. I think two is sufficient. It may take three and we would like to have that discussed at that time for the rule changes. I do, also, wish to ask that I be excused on Monday. Also Senator Dick Lewis, we are going to go to Washington, D. C. An attempt is being made through the Federal Parks Commission or Committee, Department, that a national monument of some type be erected here in Nebraska and I am sure that it will be in the vicinity of McCook, if successful, in honor and memory of Senator George W. Norris. Not only is he the father of the REA's as we now know them but he is also, along with others, was very instrumental in bringing about the creation of the Unicameral Legislature and so I ask that I and Senator Dick Lewis be excused on Monday. On Tuesday, we will discuss the issue at hand about floor changes and I make a motion we adjourn until 10 o'clock Monday morning.

PRESIDENT: There is a motion to adjourn until 10 o'clock Monday. All in favor signify by saying aye. Opposed. We are adjourned until 10 o'clock Monday.
