SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, this is the second of four. This one deals specifically with Section 43-210 of the statutes and deals particularly with any kind of procedure dealing with revocation of probation for juveniles. The same standards would again apply for the protection, for the due process protection of juveniles when they have violated or have been revoked on their probation. So it is drafted to provide the due process, due process guaranteed by the Constitution.

PRESIDENT: The question is Senator Luedtke's request for the introduction of a bill. Machine vote requiring 30 votes. Record your voted. Have you voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, 18 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is introduced. Senator Luedtke.

CLERK: Request #715. Read.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, again, you will find your Request #'s with the explanation of the bills on your desk. Request #715 deals with an informal adjustment of cases prior to the judicatory hearing in the Juvenile Court itself. This allows for a manner of handling juveniles before you actually get to the trial stage of the hearing in Juvenile Court.

PRESIDENT: The question is, Senator Luedtke's Request #715. It requires 30 votes. Record your vote. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is introduced.

CLERK: Mr. President, I move the introduction of the attached bill. Request #716. Read.

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Yes, Mr. President and members of the Legislature, this is the fourth and the last one of the requests of the Committee of Children and Youth bills through our subcommittee on juvenile justice. This particular one, as the Clerk mentioned in the title, deals with the advising of those juveniles who appear in Juvenile Court, whether it be County Court or the separate Juvenile Court, without counsel, advising them of their rights to counsel, providing them procedure for acceptance and deferring acceptance of the admission of any charges that they have made.

PRESIDENT: The question is, Senator Luedtke's request #716 for the introduction of a bill. It requires 30 votes. Record your votes. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is introduced.

CLERK: LB 540. Read title. LB 541. Read title. LB 542. Read title. LB 543. Read title. That is all, Mr. President.
