The rush is we don't want to get so clogged up with a number of bills later in the session. That's been one of the things we've been fighting, fighting, fighting. Now that we have this board ready to move, let's move. Those people who have their bills ready to move, let's vote on them. I'm ready to vote on every one of them.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hasebroock.

SENATOR HASEBROOCK: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I oppose to bracketing the constitutional amendments. I think they should follow their regular course. There is no intent of jamming them. I think they are going through in an orderly fashion. I think this is the only way that we can vote on them as they get there. I don't know why we want to have them all at one time. I believe this way we'll have a little more time to concentrate on these two rather than have them all at one time. I am strictly in favor of moving them on in the regular fashion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'll bring this up to the desk. I would like to amend Senator Kelly's motion to include the bracketing of all bills of similar subject matter on Select File.

PRESIDENT: By similar subject matter you mean all constitutional amendment bills, Senator Chambers? Regular bills. Bracket all regular bills. Is there any discussion on the Chambers amendment? Are you ready for the vote? We are voting on the Chambers amendment to bracket all bills on Select File. Record your vote. Have you voted? Record Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 24 nays.

PRESIDENT: The amendment fails. Are you ready for the question on the Kelly motion? Senator Kelly, your motion went to LB 94 constitutional amendment, did it not?

SENATOR KELLY: Yes sir.

PRESIDENT: Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: I just want to add one thing from a mechanical standpoint (mic inactivated)

CLERK: (mic inactivated) . . . constitutional amendments catch up with it. Signed, Senator Kelly.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, I yield the closing to Senator Fowler.
