PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? The question is, shall LB 233 be advanced to E & R initial. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 35 ayes, 0 nays.

Mr. President, there is a Rules Committee report from the Rules Committee, which is an amendment to the one found on page 375 of the Legislative Journal. (Read rule).

SPEAKER: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, yesterday we discussed this rule change and we had some conflict on it. We went to work with legal staff and all the people that had any serious objection to it. What we have here today is a compromise which Senator Burbach and all the members of the Rule Committee, with the exception of Senator Chambers, do feel is necessary and which we would like to see passed today. Senator Burbach believes it's necessary to have this for him to implement the program he wants. The Rules Committee believes it's necessary (mic inactivated) . . . could be implemented Monday in conjunction with the other things we've already done.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I have gone over the change and talked with Senator Burbach on them and Senator DeCamp. What was a definite conflict yesterday has been changed and now gives the prerogative of a day within the framework of what the motion called for in its own section of the rules, and gives the Speaker, on setting agendas, the prerogative of talking with the makers of the motions. Then picking a day when they can get together and bring this up. Something that would not overload the agenda on a certain day. Would be able to keep us going in an orderly fashion.
