SPEAKER: Is there any discussion for informational purposes. Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: Yes. Since Senator Burbach isn't making a motion, then I don't know how I'll stand on that but I want it strictly understood. Regardless if he makes a motion, the intent was of this Legislature that we'd take up 145 tomorrow after Final Reading and I think that regardless of what changes you might make, that is a lady's and gentlemen's understanding.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion on the--Clerk, do you have Titles.

CLERK: We should read the title of those bills that we introduced. LB 546. Introduced by Senator Maresh, Chairman of the Labor Committee and signed by other members of the Labor Committee. Read. LB 547. Introduced by the Executive Board and signed by the members thereof. Read. Mr. President, we have some Committee Reports. Your Committee on Retirement Systems to whom was referred LB 236 instructs me to report the same to the Legislature the recommendation it be advanced to General File. LB 43, indefinitely postponed. LB 48, indefinitely postponed. LB 199, indefinitely postponed. Signed Senator Hasebroock, Chairman. Mr. President, unanimous consent to insert amendments in the Journal to LB 81. Signed Senator Simpson.

SPEAKER: Any objection to unanimous consent. If not, so ordered. I would like to make some more introductions. There are four ladies here from the Corrigan School PTA. They are in Senator Mahoney's district. I am not sure which balcony they are in. Oh, here they are, up there. Glad to have you here and, also, in the North balcony, we have nine students from Clay Center High School and they are in Senator Kremer's district and they have Jim Kubik with them. Glad to have you. Go to Select File.

CLERK: Mr. President, we appear to have just one bill, that would be LB 139, on Select File.

SPEAKER: Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. Chairman, I move the adoption of the amendments to 139.

SPEAKER: Move to adopt the amendments. Any discussion. If not, all those in favor say aye. Opposed say nay. The amendments are adopted. What will we do with the bill?

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. Chairman, I move the advancement of LB 139 to Enrollment and Review for engrossing.

SPEAKER: Any discussion. If not, the motion is to advance the bill. All in favor say aye. Oppose say nay. The bill is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, we have a motion pending on LB 82. I move to return 82 to Select File for a specific amendment. Signed Senator Dworak. The specific amendment is as follows: Read. See Page 456, Journal.
