SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I move adoption of the amendment and I did have it printed and put in the Journal yesterday. It does a minor thing and I will tell you exactly the history of it and then you can make up your own mind what you wish to do but when we put the prestige plates out that could be bought for certain cars, we made a policy that on them they could only have one numeral. Now some people had some reasons to think that they would like to have more than one numeral on these prestige plates and there was no way under the statute it could be done. So this amendment would allow three numerals. They would be separated from where the space would be for counties and so on, so there would not be a problem on this end and the specifics of why, and this is the only thing it does, is that former Senator Stahmer asked me to put this in and he has a pride in ownership in a couple of bills that passed this Legislature and I don't know as I would always want it myself to let people know, the shape one of them is in right now, anyhow, that I had it on my car but 403 and 302 were the numbers he would like to have and, if we would adopt this amendment and the bill would pass with that on, then Senator Stahmer would request to get these numbers for his two cars and so this is the entirety of what the amendment does and with that, I would ask you to adopt the amendment if you wish to support it on the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I just wanted to indicate that I would relinquish 772 to anybody who would like to have it on their plate.

PRESIDENT: Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: It is anticlimactic now. I was going to say I am happy to see he has the courage to acknowledge it.

PRESIDENT: The rumors that he is under guardianship are not true. The motion is the Simpson-Stahmer amendment. Is there any further discussion? It is a machine vote, requiring 25 votes. Record your vote. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 32 ayes, Mr. President, on motion to adopt.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, I move that LB 81 be advanced to E & R for engrossing.

PRESIDENT: Is there any discussion on the motion? The question is, shall LB 81 as amended be advanced to E & R Final. All in favor say aye. Contrary. Motion passes.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 85.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of the amendments to LB 85. Is there any discussion? All in favor say aye. Contrary. The amendments are adopted.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, I move that LB 85 be advanced to Enrollment and Review for engrossing.

PRESIDENT: Is there any discussion? Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: I've got an amendment on the floor, up there in the Clerk's office on 85. This is the amendment I talked
