CLERK: 9 ayes, 25 nays.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails. The matter before the body is the motion to advance LB 127. Are you ready for the question? Senator Burrows.

SENATOR BURROWS: Briefly explain the bill, the purpose of the bill.

PRESIDENT: The chair recognizes Senator Burrows.

SENATOR BURROWS: This bill was introduced to broaden the choice of the employee in physician so he had his freedom of choice and we got together on a definition that came out of Committee that was acceptable to both labor and management. The secondary purpose in this bill is to provide for replacement of replacement limbs, artificial limbs that might be passed on, and the intent and purpose was to get labor and management together for freedom of choice, I think a very simple intent in this bill. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall...do you wish to close Senator Marsh? The question is, shall LB 127 advance with Committee amendments. Record your vote. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 14 nays, 6 not voting. (Mike not activated) to whom was referred LB 98 instructs me to report the same to the Legislature the recommendation it be advanced to General File as amended, LB 260 to General File as amended. Signed Senator Syas, Chairman. Mr. President, your Committee on Judiciary to whom was referred LB 284 instructs me to report the same to the Legislature the recommendation it be advanced to General File as amended, LB 285, General File and LB 286, General File. Signed Senator Luedtke, Chairman. Mr. President, Rules Committee report. Signed Senator DeCamp. Public Works Committee gives notice of public hearings. Signed Senator Kremer, Chairman. Mr. President, Committee on Committees report. Signed Senator Savage, Chairman. Mr. President, another Rules Committee report. Signed Senator DeCamp, Chairman, and Education. That's all, Mr. President.
