PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of the Cavanaugh amendment. Record your vote. Record your vote. Wait . . . strike that . . . would the senators please vote. We have 20 non-voting senators. Record Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 9 nays, 14 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The amendment carries. Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. Chairman, I move the bill be moved to E & R initial.

PRESIDENT: Is there any discussion? The question is, shall LB 165, as amended by the committee and the Cavanaugh amendment, be advanced to E & R initial. Record your vote. Record Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, 18 not voting, on motion to advance.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. LB 165 is so advanced. On General File LB 83.

CLERK: Read bill.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Kennedy.

SENATOR KENNEDY: Mr. President, fellow members, there are committee amendments. On page 2, line 12 strike "not more than one" and insert "the owner lives in which any"; line 18 after "way" insert "to accomodate the special needs to any leasee" and strike "such persons shall not be" and then strike line 19 and 21. Actually, this would be in a home where they had one room for rent or one apartment for rent and the person that owned the place might be living there, so that they would have an opportunity to not be bothered particularly by a dog, so this would eliminate them. Then on page 3, line 1 insert "any person who rents, leases, or provides housing accomodations for compensation may demand or receive a reasonable dog guide deposit, not to exceed 1/4 of one months period rent". This would be . . . they could ask for 1/4 of one months rent to deposit in case of some damage by the dog. Then in Section 5, Section 21-25 Revised Statutes Supplement 1974 be amended to read as follows: "any person, firm, or corporation, or the agent of any person, firm, or corporation who denies or interferes with admittance to employee to public facility in Section 21-27, or otherwise interferes the rights of total or partially blind or otherwise physically disabled persons under Section 21-27, Section 1-4, this act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine not less than ten nor more than one hundred dollars". This would be if they deprive this person of renting those facilities. I would move for the committee amendments adoption at this time. Any questions?

SPEAKER: Any further amendments . . . any further discussion? If not we will vote. Have you voted? Record Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President.
