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They have to go with agreement with the other...with those that have existing facilities.

SENATOR MURPHY: Is that provided for in here, Senator Goodrich?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes, on Page 14 of the bill.

SENATOR MURPHY: Thank you.

SPEAKER: The chair recognizes Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: I have a question of Senator Goodrich.

SPEAKER: Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes.

SENATOR DUIS: Senator Goodrich, your choice of words that you just answered there with bothers me just a little bit. Would you explain what you mean by disrupt?

SENATOR GOODRICH: OK. If, for example, the joint venture facility is going to use an existing line owned we will say, for example...Nebraska Public Power, Omaha Public Power and, probably, who knows what other city are going to actually joint venture build the next nuclear plant at Fort Calhoun. Now they have got, for example, to transfer that power from there to Grand Island, if Grand Island happens to buy a piece of it. Now Nebraska Public Power owns lines between...Omaha Public Power and Nebraska Public Power combined own lines between Omaha or Fort Calhoun and Grand Island. If, for example, the transferring of this power to Grand Island would disrupt the service or interfere with the service to York, Nebraska, a town that we pass in the meantime, on the way, in other words, if that would disrupt that service, then they can't use that existing line. They must build adequate facilities to transmit this power. They can't, in other words, disrupt the service to existing customers just to deliver this power from the nuclear plant in Fort Calhoun to the city of Grand Island.

SENATOR DUIS: Then that is your answer to what the word disrupt meant when you were giving your statement on that.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes.

SENATOR DUIS: Thank you very much because I want that in the record.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion? If not, the motion is to advance LB 104 to E & R Initial. Senator Lewis. Sorry, Dick Lewis.

SENATOR LEWIS: Well, Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I have a bill in Committee which provides that we have a Power Grid Board to review a lot of these problems and I think there are problems. I think I have indicated it to you. I would like to have this bill, 104, bracketed and hold it until this other bill hits the floor.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion? Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: I would encourage the body not to do that. First of all, we don't even know if it is going to come out of the Committee yet. I would, still, renew my motion to advance to E & R Initial.
