Urban Affairs gives notice that it has set bills for March 5th and 12th. Signed Senator Fowler, Chairman. Mr. President, your committee on Constitutional Revision and Recreation to whom was referred LB 195 instructs me to report the same the recommendation it be advanced to General File, LB 429 General File, LB 489 General File. Signed Senator Syas, Chairman. Mr. President, your committee on Urban Affairs to whom was referred LB 67 instructs me to report the same to the Legislature the recommendation it be advanced to General File as amended. Signed Senator Fowler, Chairman. Mr. President, your committee on Public Works to whom was referred LB 24 instructs me to report the same to the Legislature the recommendation it be advanced to General File and LB 523 indefinitely postponed. Signed Senator Kremer, Chairman. Mr. President, your committee on Government to whom was referred LB 151 instructs me to report the same to the Legislature the recommendation it be advanced to General File, LB 375 to General File and LB 377 General File. Signed Senator Rasmussen, Chairman.

PRESIDENT: The Speaker has suggested that we move to #12 on your agenda. Senator Anderson's moving to withdraw LB 513. The chair recognizes Senator Anderson.

SENATOR ANDERSON: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, this bill has become a superfluous bill because of some amendments that have been adopted by the Judiciary Committee in LB 243. This means we are simply duplicating what has already been heard and decided upon by one committee and would be decided on by the Legislature so I simply move the withdrawal of the bill.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion. Is there any further debate or comment? The question is, shall LB 513 be withdrawn. Record your vote. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is withdrawn. We are very happy to have some students from the Northeast Technical College of Norfolk in the South balcony, guests of Senator Kennedy. Thank you for coming. LB 18 on General File.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 18, introduced by Senator Marsh of the 29th District. Read title. This bill was first considered February 21st, Mr. President. There were no Committee amendments. The bill was bracketed then until today on the 24th. The bill has previously been discussed. There is now pending a motion to indefinitely postpone LB 18. Signed Senator DeCamp.

PRESIDENT: The chair recognizes Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: I guess I will hear the motion by Senator DeCamp first, please, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: I'll withdraw that motion at this time.

PRESIDENT: Asking unanimous consent to withdraw your amendment to LB 18?

SENATOR DeCAMP: LB 18. That's the bill on drivers licenses.
