

PRESIDENT: Is there any objection to the motion, unanimous consent to withdraw the amendment? It carries. Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, I renew my motion to advance LR 18 to Enrollment and Review Initial. This is a proposal requested by the Driver's Education Instructors at the OK of the State Department of Education saying we will put in the responsible hands of the State Department of Education all the educational requirements of our young people in high schools including this one area. I move for the advancement of LR 18.

PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: According to my book, I don't have LR 18 listed in it. I don't even know what it pertains to, Shirley. Would you give us...or tell us where it is at in the Journal, or something, so we can look at it and see what we are talking about.

SENATOR MARSH: LB..

SENATOR GOODRICH: LB 18. Ok.

PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich, do you wish to be heard further?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes. Senator Marsh, would you yield to a question, please? Senator Marsh, on this particular bill, have you made any changes in the bill that would provide for funding of the program that we are mandating?

SENATOR MARSH: Absolutely not.

SENATOR GOODRICH: OK.

PRESIDENT: Is there further debate? Senator Marsh, do you wish to be recognized for closing? The question is, shall LB 18 be advanced to E & R Initial. Record your vote. Would you please record your vote? We could save a lot of time if you would vote, please. Would you please vote? The chair recognizes Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: I move for a call of the house, Mr. President. We need three more votes and we're moving slowly.

PRESIDENT: What...the chair didn't hear you, Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: We are voting on the advancement of LR 18.. LB 18.

PRESIDENT: And does that have amendments, Senator?

SENATOR MARSH: That does not have amendments, Mr. President, and I..

PRESIDENT: I see.

SENATOR MARSH: ...I still am needing 25 votes on LB 18.

PRESIDENT: I see.

SENATOR MARSH: I guess I ask for a Call of the House, Mr. President. We seem to have 15 people not on the vote.
