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this whole driver's education program, what are we talking about on an annual basis to go to the 1200 school districts?

PRESIDENT: Can you answer that succinctly, Senator? How much money are we talking about annually involved in the driver education program?

SENATOR DeCAMP: That depends to a degree on the number of people involved in the program. I would assume your department, your committee would have that information very accurately and in detail.

SENATOR LEWIS: Just give me an estimate. Are we talking about a million dollars...

PRESIDENT: Can you give an estimate, Senator? You cannot. Senator, do you have another question?

SENATOR LEWIS: Well, I just wondered if it was a huge sum based on his speech...

PRESIDENT: He cannot answer the question, Senator. Do you have another question, Senator.

SENATOR LEWIS: I will let it ride. I will let it ride.

PRESIDENT: Well, you may ask a question for information Senator DeCamp has.

SENATOR LEWIS: Based on what Senator DeCamp said about the bill, I am not sure he has any information.

PRESIDENT: That's out of order, Senator. The question is, the DeCamp motion to indefinitely postpone LB 18. Record your vote. Please record your vote, Senators. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 14 nays, 9 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. The bill is indefinitely postponed. LB 105. Senator Lewis, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR LEWIS: Mr. Chairman, I was out of the room and I missed part of Senator DeCamp's speech on the last one and I asked for a personal privilege on the issue.

PRESIDENT: That's not within the definition of a personal privilege.

SENATOR LEWIS: I am not asking to speak on the issue. I know that Senator DeCamp (inaudible)...

PRESIDENT: Senator, state your point of personal privilege, please.

SENATOR LEWIS: I would like a copy of his speech and I am sure it is lifeline speech #97 and I will give him my 25¢ if he will give it to me. I missed it.

PRESIDENT: The chair overrules your point of personal privilege, Senator. LB...

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, a point of personal privilege.
