SPEAKER: Motion has been made and seconded that LB 294 be advanced to E & R for engrossment. All in favor indicate by the usual sign. Opposed. Motion carried.

CLERK: Mr. President, your Enrolling Clerk reports that she did on this day present to the Governor for his approval LB 45, 83, 165, 194, 196 and 355. Signed Barbara Jackson, Enrolling Clerk. Mr. President, your committee on Enrollment and Review reports we have examined and reviewed LB 13 and find the same correctly engrossed, LB 108 correctly engrossed, ...LB 13 correctly engrossed, LB 77 correctly engrossed, LB 108 correctly engrossed, LB 290 correctly engrossed, and LB 251 correctly engrossed. Signed Don Dworak, Chairman. Mr. President, your committee on Enrollment and Review reports we have examined and reviewed LB 126 and find the same correctly enrolled, LB 122, and they are not in order either, LB 27 correctly enrolled, LB 122 correctly enrolled and LB 126.

SPEAKER: While the Legislature is in session and capable of doing business, I sign...I am about to sign and do sign LB 27, LB 122, and LB 126.

CLERK: That is all, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: We will now go to General File and we have a motion to indefinitely postpone LB 388, the constitutional amendment. The chair recognizes Senator Cavanaugh.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, I would like to bracket this bill, if that is acceptable. The reason being is that I think the bill raises major questions, some of which we are going to have to find an answer to whether we kill this bill or pass it. We still are going to have to find an answer to the problems that it presents to us and I think we should have a little more time to explore it. So I would move that it be bracketed until next week.

SPEAKER: The chair recognizes Senator Stull.

SENATOR STULL: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I think that what Senator Cavanaugh is correct but I talked with Senator Koch this morning and I would ask to have 388 bracketed and I will prepare an interim study on this subject and I want the bill bracketed until next session. I so move.

SPEAKER: Do I hear any objections? If not, so...Senator Stull.

SENATOR STULL: Wouldn't Senator Koch have to withdraw his motion to kill. O. K.

SPEAKER: Any objections. If not, so ordered. We are now ready for LB 20. LB 20.

CLERK: LB 20 introduced by Senator Maresh of the 29th district. A bill for an act to amend sections 2815.01, 2815.02 2815.03, and 2815.04 and 2815.06 relating to abuse of minor children and incompetent or disabled persons; to redefine terms; to provide for protection for neglected persons; to repeal the original sections. The bill was first considered yesterday, Mr. President, at which time the Committee amend-
