SPEAKER: The Clerk shall record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 4 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The bill is advanced.

CLERK: LB 15. Senator Barnett asks unanimous consent to bracket LB 15 until March 5th. Signed Senator Barnett.

SPEAKER: Any objection. If not, so ordered.

CLERK: LB 156 introduced by Senator Carsten of the 2nd District. Read title. There is a Committee amendment by Senator Anderson's Miscellaneous Subjects Committee.

SENATOR ANDERSON: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the bill itself has to do with the voting requirements for cooperative corporations and at the hearing on this bill, there was no opposition per se but a member representative of the electrical coops did indicate that they were satisfied with the legislation in this regard as it applied to them and they wanted to make sure that there was an amendment put in that would not include them. So this is simply making it clear that electrical cooperatives or electrical member associations are not included in the act, itself. So I would move the adoption of the Committee amendments.

It has not created any serious procedural problems but it is just updating it to a point where and complies with what they are now doing and it is in compliance with the federal corporation laws and it just brings it up to date. I move for the advancement to E & R Initial, Mr. President.
