SENATOR HASEBROCK: You heard the motion as read by the Clerk. This is exactly what we'd like to do is change it from 1974 to 1975. I move that it be returned to E & R for engrossment and so changed.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? The question is, shall LB 45 be returned to E & R for final engrossing . . . or for specific amendment and final engrossing. Record your vote. Record Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 35 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries and the bill is so referred.

CLERK: (mic inactivated) . . . couple motions on LB 81. Mr. President a motion. I move to return LB 81 to Select File for the following specific amendment. Amend Section 1, line 14 by placing a period after "used". Strike "but" in lines 15, 16 and 17. Signed, Senator Simpson.

PRESIDENT: Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move to return the bill to Select File for the specific amendment. This amendment has to do with the prestige plates in the little section I put in there that it does knock out some people that already have plates because we were attempting to keep it so that they would not interfere with the county numbers as such now. The change would only say that you couldn't have over three numerals.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? The question is the return of LB 81 to E & R final. Record your vote. Record Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 41 ayes, 1 nay, 7 not voting on motion to return to Select File.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. Mr. Clerk would you please read on Final Reading LB 276. We have a motion on the table.

CLERK: Mr. President, I move to return LB 276 to Select File for specific amendment. To strike the word "felony" in line 5 on page 2. Signed, Senator Duis.

PRESIDENT: Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature and Senator Luedtke, good morning. I do wish to return this bill to Select File and I make this motion for striking the word "felony". I do have an Attorney General's letter here, which is in the Journal. I wish I knew which page it was. Do you mind, I'll look it up.

CLERK: It's on page 685, Senator.

SENATOR DUIS: 686, I believe is the actual letter, the top of the page. They state in the letter here that the term "felony" signifies an offense as may be punished with death or imprisonment in the Nebraska Penal and Correctional Complex. Any other offense is denominated as a misdemeanor. Now, Mr. President, should I explain
