CLERK: 41 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: The Call is raised. Report the vote. Please stay in the chamber. The Speaker has an important announcement, at least he says it's important.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 7 nays, Mr. President.

Mr. President, Banking sets hearings on 590 on March 18th at 2 o'clock, no time I assume 2 o'clock.

Mr. President, there will be inserted in the Journal a report of employees who have worked with the Legislature and the total salaries paid under date of March 11th.

Mr. President, there is a rule change pending.

Mr. President, I move we adjourn.

PRESIDENT: There is a motion to adjourn. All in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. We are adjourned.
