CLERK: 32 ayes, 7 nays on motion to cease debate.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. The debate ceases. The chair recognizes Senator Stoney for purpose of closing debate by way of reply.

SENATOR STONEY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, first I would like to thank Senator Nichol for seeing the light and to further respond to something that Senator Murphy mentioned pertaining to possession of a degree, I am not intimating that because a person has a degree that they are a better or more qualified teacher but I do feel that these well qualified teachers that we presently have that do not have this certification would be, in my estimation, possibly better instructors with these additional credits and with this degree. This bill passed on Final Reading by a vote of 35 to 5 and, once again, I would ask you to vote with me on overriding the Governor and enacting LB 122 into law. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall LB 122 become law notwithstanding the Governor's veto. Record your vote. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk. Senator Stoney.

SENATOR STONEY: I believe I had my hand up. I would like a Call of the House, please. Roll call vote, also.

PRESIDENT: There has been a request for a Call of the House. Record your vote. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 4 nays on the Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: The House is under Call. Would all Senators please take their chairs and record your presence promptly. Thank you. Senator Stoney, did you request a Roll Call vote.

CLERK: Senator Anderson. No.
