PRESIDENT: Alright, read the amendment again.

CLERK: Read amendment.

PRESIDENT: Since we've had the reading the board will be open for another 10 seconds for any changes. Record Mr. Clerk. Senator Frank Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: I ask for a Call of the House. This is a substantive amendment.

SENATOR DWORAK: I move that LB 193 be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT: Alright. Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Senator Lewis, I'd like to ask you a question. I haven't studied the bill real thoroughly but I understand that the only one that appeared in favor of it was George Miller from Papillion, editor of the paper that predominantly covers Sarpe county.
