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you'll notice, every piece of paper that lawyer makes out for you, or anything that ever happens, you're the one that signs it, not that lawyer. You're just signing it under his opinion and his best thoughts. That's all you get for your money is just his best thoughts. Senator Chambers had mentioned earlier that maybe he had an alternative and he tended to touch on an alternative, but he didn't get into it very much. I would ask Senator Chambers at this time for two and a half minutes of what his alternative might be.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you Senator Kelly. I assure all of you I'm not tearing down just for the sake of tearing down. That's one of the most convenient ways to cop a plea. I say that there is a court administrator who exists right now. This court administrator is a part of the judicial system. This court administrator could be given a staff whose job is to receive complaints from the public, investigate the complaint, and report to that individual on the disposition of the case. As it is now there are various committees and I don't think even the lawyers in here could name every committee by name which is supposed to be involved in discipline with the Bar Association. They are made up of voluntary, working lawyers who may or may not attend committee meetings. They can say everything is done in secret so they need not make a report. If this job is done through the court administrators office there is an identifiable body of people who will investigate the complaint, report on the disposition, and if a recommendation should be made to the court there is a way to trace, from the time the complaint is given to its ultimate disposition, what was done, who did it, and why. As it exists now once a complaint is filed there is no way to know whether it's in limbo or if anything is being done at all.

PRESIDENT: You have one minute left Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Thank you Senator Chambers. Recognize that the constitutional amendment would do away with the Bar Association and implement, maybe, some nebulous for Senator Chambers may have a good idea. We do know what the Bar Association is. Imperfect as it is it's in place and it has been working since 1937. I, again, am not here to plead for my cousins the lawyers. I'm just here to plead for the Nebraska State Supreme Court. If they want the court administrator to do this function all they got to do is just write one memo and it's in place without a constitutional amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. President, members of the body, I call for the previous question.

PRESIDENT: The question is shall debate cease. Record your vote. I see five seconds. Record Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 7 nays to cease debate.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. Debate shall cease. Senator Warner do you choose to close debate by way of reply?
