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those people in order to get Federal funds. I, for one, want to see where those Federal funds are going. Mr. Chairman, until somebody can bring forth the information, I have no objection to bracketing the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, as far as bracketing the bill is concerned, I don't think that solves the problem. The problem of bracketing this bill has nothing to do with holding up and getting the information. If you want to bracket what you are, in effect, saying is that you're going to agree to earmark funds for the bill. You can get the information without bracketing this bill. I think what we should do is move this bill forward, as it is without the DeCamp amendment. The information is available to any Senator that just wants to go down and talk to one of the fiscal analysts. They can give them the information. What I have said is the truth. The money's there. If you don't believe me you can go down and ask the staff.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'm going to try to give you a couple of reasons for bracketing it, pull back the covers of a few things here. The reason this bill is hustling on through, ahead of some others, is because right behind it, not very far, is a bill to increase judges salaries by about 50 percent. They're only getting \$20,000, some \$27,000. We've got to get them up another 50 percent increase. If this bill gets through, and this money then goes into the general fund, then we can stand up on the floor and we can say, 'well yes this isn't any increase in money. We just passed a bill to get the money for the judges pay raise'. That justifies, then, our increase in the judges by 50 percent, or whatever it comes out to, maybe a little more than that. All I'm saying in this bill, and trying to bring to your attention at this time, is if you're going to increase these court costs then let the money go directly into those areas where it will probably do the most good. Highway safety is what everybody comes up here with a bill to promote and sponsor. Oh, here's your opportunity . . . some money directly into highway safety . . . specific thing. Why don't you bracket it. We'll get all the facts for you. We'll find out how much money. Senator Barnett has talked about some money. I think that's possible. The money can be gotten. It isn't available now, contrary to what I think people have been made to believe. There may be a method of getting that. Maybe when we get all done looking at everything, get all the covers pulled back, we'll say we got the highway safety money from the Appropriations Committee. Guess what, we don't really need that 50 percent increase. Guess what, maybe we don't even need 287. So why don't you bracket it until we get a lot of other things cleared up.

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedtke.
