SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, once again I shall try to explain to you what the problem is. The noble experiment, and Senator Murphy I was first to admit it was the Judiciary Committee that put this 5 day waiting period on the books with this Legislatures help. It has not worked out. PRESIDENT: Well when our veteran gets back, perhaps we can discuss it further. Senator Kelly, do you wish to be recognized, or was that on this other matter?

SENATOR KELLY: Are we laying over the kill motion on 295?

PRESIDENT: Well, our new rules provide that it must be laid over on Select File.

SENATOR KELLY: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: It seems to the Chair that it would be only appropriate that debate be had on the day that you can vote.

SENATOR KELLY: I'll save my gems and polish them a little more.

PRESIDENT: We're all awaiting that with baited breath. Senator Burbach.
