PRESIDENT: Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: All I want to say is I voted to put the Mills amendment on. It probably isn't a bad idea. The only thing about it is that I think you made the bill unconstitutional by so doing. I think if you look in the Constitution, at least the way I interpret it, where our office is set in the Constitution. I think you'd have to change this into a constitutional amendment, the way I look at it. I don't think the bill's going to survive anyhow.

PRESIDENT: Senator George are you ready to close debate? You can waive it. The question is the motion by Senator George to indefinitely postpone. Record your vote. Have you voted? Have all of you voted on this matter? Record Mr. Clerk. Senator Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: I think this is a vital bill. I'd ask for a Call of the House, then I'd want a record vote.

PRESIDENT: Clear the board Mr. Clerk. Question is, shall the House go under Call. Record Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 8 ayes, 24 nays to go under Call.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. Chairman, I'd ask for a record vote on the previous motion.

CLERK: Mr. President, voting aye Senators Barnett, Burbach, Carsten, Dickinson, Fitzgerald, George, Keyes, R. Lewis, Luedtke, Maresh, Marsh, Moylan, Murphy, Rumery, Stull, Swigart, Syas, Warner.

Voting nay Senators Anderson, Burrows, Clark, Dworak, Goodrich, Kelly, Kime, Koch, R. Lewis . . . correction F. Lewis, Mahoney, Marvel, Mills, Rasmussen, Skarda and Stoney.

Not voting Senators Bereuter, Cavanaugh, Chambers, Cope, DeCamp, Duis, Fowler, Hasebroock, Johnson, Kennedy, Kremer, Nichol, Savage, Schmit, Simpson and Wiltse.

18 ayes, 15 nays, 16 not voting. That kills it.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The bill is killed, or indefinitely postponed.

CLERK: I still have further amendments Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: In the North balcony, Senator Anderson reminds the Chair that, there are some 30 students and parents from District 72 in Nuckolls County. Welcome to the Nebraska Legislature. We appreciate having you here.
