PRESIDENT: The Legislature will please come to order.  
All rise for the morning prayer.

CHAPLAIN: Prayer given.

PRESIDENT: Roll call. Please record your presence.  
Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Corrections in the Journal.

CLERK: None, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Are there corrections from the floor in the  
Journal? Seeing none, the Journal shall stand.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Stoney asked to be excused  
until he arrives.

PRESIDENT: Committee hearings and reports.

CLERK: Mr. President, your committee on Enrollment and  
Review to whom was referred LB 254 instructs me to report  
the same to the Legislature the recommendation it be  
advanced to Select File as amended. Your committee has  
examined and reviewed LB 323 and recommend that it be  
placed on Select File as amended. Signed Senator Dworak,  
Chairman. Mr. President, your committee on Enrollment  
and Review reports we have examined and engrossed LB 277  
and find the same correctly engrossed; LB 295 correctly  
engrossed. Signed Senator Dworak, Chairman. Mr. Presi-  
dent, your committee on Miscellaneous Subjects to whom  
was referred LB 342 instructs me to report the same to  
the Legislature the recommendation it be advanced to  
General File. Signed Senator Anderson, Chairman. Mr. Presi-  
dent, your committee on Judiciary to whom was referred  
LB 567 instructs me to report the same to the Legislature  
the recommendation it be advanced to General File as  
amended. Signed Senator Luedtke, Chairman. Mr. Presi-  
dent, your committee on Constitutional Revision to whom  
was referred LB 110 instructs me to report the same  
indefinitely postponed; LB 133 indefinitely postponed;  
and LB 424 indefinitely postponed. Signed Senator Syas,
