PRESIDENT: Motion carries. The bill has been returned to Select File. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move that the specific amendment be adopted. It is as I have already explained.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion? The question is the adoption of the specific amendment proposed by Senator Warner. Record your vote. Record Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. The specific amendment is adopted. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move that LB 493 be re-advanced to E & R for engrossing.

PRESIDENT: Discussion of that motion? All those in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. The bill, as amended, is so advanced.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, I have another motion to return LB 493 for specific amendment. Signed, Senator Koch.

PRESIDENT: Senator.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. President, members of the body, I ask unanimous consent to withdraw that amendment.

PRESIDENT: There has been a unanimous consent request to withdraw the motion. Are there objections? Seeing none, it is so ordered.

CLERK: Pursuant to the Speaker's request to go on to Select File . . .

PRESIDENT: Senator Duis for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR DUIS: Point of order sir. I just wanted to check with you if it was alright. In changing the bill, 493, with that particular specific amendment did it change the bill sufficiently enough to require a public hearing?

PRESIDENT: Well it would be the Chairs' view that in the absence of a request for that the matter never comes to light.

SENATOR DUIS: Thank you very much. I just wanted to know what your opinion was.

PRESIDENT: Well if the matter is not brought before the Chair, but I think that would be for the body to determine rather . . . all the Chair would do is ask the body to vote on it.

SENATOR DUIS: I understand that, but I thought that the rule called for someone to make a decision as to whether or not it changes it sufficiently enough to require a hearing. Thank you.
