PRESIDENT: There is a request for unanimous consent to lay over 303 until Wednesday. Are there objections? Seeing none it is so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, unanimous consent request to bracket 288 on E & R final.

PRESIDENT: Who makes the request?

CLERK: Senator . . . I'm sorry. Signed, Senator Luedtke.

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedtke asked for unanimous consent to bracket 288. Till when, Senator Luedtke?

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Yes. Well until we obtain an amendment which is being prepared by the bill drafters.

PRESIDENT: Alright. Are there objections? Seeing none it is so ordered.

We're now off Select File and we move to General File. We passed 306 because Senator Wiltse was not here yesterday. Excuse me Senator Wiltse. Apparently, we're going to back up to 259.

CLERK: Read title.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman, a point of information from the Chair. It is a necessary amendment to the committee amendment because it makes reference to the wrong section. Do you want to adopt these first, or go ahead and adopt the committee amendments, or at least discuss them?

PRESIDENT: If there is no objection it is more expeditious if we get the amendments to the amendments first.

SENATOR KREMER: Then Mr. Chairman I offer this amendment to the amendments. The purpose of this is reference was made to the wrong section. That's all it does. It has no substantiative change at all. It reads, on page 25, line 14 and line 23, and on page 26, line 24 strike the numeral "9" and insert "5". "Five" is correct, nine was wrong.

PRESIDENT: This is a mere numerical correction.

SENATOR KREMER: I move the adoption of the amendment to the committee amendment.

PRESIDENT: There is a motion to make a correction. Any discussion? All those in favor . . . record your vote. Would you please vote Senators. Record Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted Senator Kremer.
