CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: 321 advances. LB 374.

CLERK: LB 374 introduced by Wm. H. Hasebroock, 18th District. Read title. There are Committee amendments by Senator Murphy's Banking Committee.

PRESIDENT: Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: Mr. Chairman, if the body doesn't mind, there are two other extensive amendments relating to eliminating wordage that designates the difference between pension and retirement in this insurance law. They were offered by Senator Duis. They relate to, as I understand, the difference between the manner in which IRS treats these additional funds and I think it would be more proper for the body to lay this bill over until Senator Duis can get into it in a little more detail.

PRESIDENT: Thank you, Senator Murphy. We will go to LB 481.

CLERK: LB 481 introduced by the Judiciary Committee and signed by the members thereof. Read title. There are no Committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, I will move LB 481 be advanced to E & R Initial. LB 481 is a follow up on the Uniform Probate Code which will go into effect on January 1, 1977. We had originally, the Judiciary Committee had originally prepared this upon the recommendation of the bill drafter that this matter being largely housekeeping matters which would only be put into the statutes if the Uniform Probate Code were to be placed on the books. We decided to handle it separately and that was a wise decision because there was no need to have this much housekeeping go into any kind of a bill, unless you were going to pass the original bill. The original bill was passed. It will go into effect January 1, 1977 and it takes all of the matter that was in the comprehensive bill that was not repealed and makes it conform to the probate code as is now on the books and I would be glad to answer any questions concerning any of them. I think it would be boring to go through every section and to show the technical details, how it correlates itself into the Probate Code.
