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they don't have to.

SENATOR KIME: Senator Rumery, that was amended out of this bill. The amendment that we just adopted requires... it reinstates the stricken matter, if you read the original bill. It reinstates all of that and requires that these proceedings be published.

FRESIDENT: Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, I have got a question for Senator Kime. Senator Kime, these meetings still have to be published in advance. You are just merely taking away the first Tuesday but they still have to be published in advance, is that correct?

SENATOR KIME: Yes, there is nothing changed in the bill at all. It just gives the Board of Directors a privilege of having these meetings in the evenings, if they want to, or in the afternoon or whenever they choose.

SENATOR DWORAK: But they still have to advise the public in advance that they are changing the time of these meetings?

SENATOR KIME: All meetings have to be...All meetings that are ordered by the President have to be published, yes, and there is nothing changed in the bill here, if you have read the bill, except the time.

PRESIDENT: Do you wish to speak further, Senator Kime? Senator Kremer, do you...

SENATOR KIME: Mr. Chairman, I move that this bill be advanced.

PRESIDENT: All right. It has been moved. Do you wish further comment, Senator Kremer?

SENATOR KREMER: Probably want a little correction in the answer Senator Kime gave to Senator Dworak. There has been one change of the word "publish" to "publicized" and the reason for this was this. These meetings do not relate themselves to all the general public but only those that are involved in the irrigation district and they can be notified through a poster or a letter and do not necessarily have to go to a legal newspaper to be published so that word "publish" is changed to "publicized" whereby they notify all the members of the association. Senator Kime, I believe you would agree with this.

PRESIDENT: Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Just a question of Senator Kremer. Sometimes we can't punch the buttons to tell we are going to speak until these people speak. Would you answer a question, please, Senator Kremer. You said in here that some of these meetings do not have a public notice. Did I understand that or what do you mean by that? They hold some of these meetings in secret. What do you mean?

SENATOR KREMER: No sir. I said that the people involved in the irrigation district are not...in this case, it does not involve all of the general public but only those that are
