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to get up to it and say that is the issue that we are going to have to face on interest rates, that is what you are going to have to do and if you don't and if you want to give the rhetoric of protecting the people with lower interest rates, lets go a little further. 5% may be too high Senator Cavanaugh. Lets make it zero and that 9% that we have now, lets cut that down to 2%. That will be extremely popular but it is going to be chaos and the chaos is going to begin in the very areas that we represent in the urban areas. That is where people are looking for jobs that are carpenters and that is where people are looking for jobs that are electricians and that is where people that are looking for jobs that are masons and when those processes are not working, then we don't have jobs for those people. I invite you to go down and look at some of the unemployment rates in those industries right now. Your position isn't different from any that I have heard. Because there is nothing that leads the country down hill like people advocating no new starts. If you haven't read the years of Sherman Adams or Eisenhower, or whoever was president at that time, it is questionable you ought to look at those so Mr. Chairman I move that....

PRESIDENT: We have a point of order.

SENATOR DICKINSON: My question is do we have a point of order or what are we talking about here? It is 5 after 4 and lets get to the issue and not be rambling around on some other issue. We wanted to...

PRESIDENT: I must reluctantly rule that Senator Lewis is talking about interest rates which is related to it.

SENATOR LEWIS: I thought that I was Senator. I will finish quickly, and I have said my piece on it.

PRESIDENT: (inaudible)

SENATOR F. LEWIS: The point is, and I don't care, but I think that is the issue and if you want to go that route, that is fine and I want to hear the same people cry about unemployment later on. Mr. Chairman I am sorry if I was out of order or if someone didn't understand the issue before the body, in either case I will try to rectify it by finishing.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marvel.

SENATOR MARVEL: I would like to move the previous question.

PRESIDENT: Question is whether the debate shall cease. Record your votes. Record Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays and 17 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries, debate stops, Chair recognizes Senator Cavanaugh for purpose of response.
