SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR MILLS: Senator Chambers, what are the renewal fees of a veterinarian practicing in Nebraska.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Kennedy told me that it is \$15 which I think is low.

SENATOR MILLS: What are the renewal fees of a medical doctor?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I don't know.

SENATOR MILLS: Thank you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: OK.

PRESIDENT: The question is, the adoption of the specific amendment. Record your vote. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 2 nays, 21 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. The amendment is adopted. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I move that the bill as amended be readvanced.

PRESIDENT: Discussion of the motion. All those in favor signify by saying aye. Contrary nay. The bill as amended is advanced.

CLERK: Motion on the desk. I move to return LB 259 to Select File for specific amendment. Signed Senator Swigart. The specific amendment is: Read. See Page 1146, Journal.

PRESIDENT: Senator Swigart.

SENATOR SWIGART: Yes, Mr. President and fellow members, I have talked to the author of LB 259 and also to the Committee Chairman, Senator Kremer, and they had, as you recall, a 30 day provision in the bill that was presented. It was amended to the effect that 30 days would be required before such revocation could be... permit could be granted to go to and from work, et cetera, and it did not... the 30 days was thrown out. I believe Senator Chambers proposed that it be deleted but it was pretty close and I thought maybe the members would want to go along with, at least, some penalty and some thinking over their evil ways and trying to amend them during those 15 days. So I have proposed that such a permit should not be granted for 15 days rather than the previous 30 days that we threw out. I believe the members might go along with this and the author of the bill does not oppose this and I am sure Senator Kremer, they both speak for themselves but Senator Kremer has expressed very much favor for this. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I am not the author of the bill but I was the author of that amendment which dropped that period and I am opposed to what
