SENATOR SIMPSON: Yes.

SENATOR KELLY: Senator Simpson, I am looking on Page 8, which is section 9, seems to be the crux of the matter on overreaching of control in mobile home parks and my question to you is the wording in there such as, mobile home accessory buildings, structure of mobile home park design and land use, permanent buildings. Are these the overreaching part? If they are, can that section be amended that would take out the excessive costs in mobile homes and still make this a workable bill? That would be my question.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Well, Senator Kelly, I'd say that I think this bill is important and if there has to be some changes made that would allow people to say that this was necessary and this would be one of the areas, then I would be willing that we would change that section. The main thing that I am interested in is the health portion of it.

SENATOR KELLY: Thank you very much, Senator, and that is my position as a member of the Committee, I did not get the attitude that this was an overreaching bill but listening to the floor debate and the very specific criticisms from Senator Bereuter, which to me has meaning, I will have to vote against the kill motion on the basis that this section can be reworked and that we can have a viable state guidelines for the health control and of the facilities that would affect health in these mobile home parks.

PRESIDENT: Senator Frank Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: I move the previous question.

PRESIDENT: The proposition is, shall debate cease. Record your vote. Have you voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. Chairman.

PRESIDENT: Yes sir.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Let's put it under Call.

PRESIDENT: Yes sir. There is a motion that the House go under Call.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: I will withdraw that.

PRESIDENT: You are withdrawing your motion that the House go under Call. Report the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 5 nays to cease debate.

PRESIDENT: Debate is ceased. Senator Mills.

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President and members of the body, the reason, again, that I am opposing this bill as several others have spoken here is that if we can find something that isn't regulated, let's regulate it and that is what I think part of this bill does. I think that it does not say it in rules and regulations but go to one of these departments and see after they have passed the bill and see how thick those rules and regulations do begin.
