SENATOR LEWIS: By whom? The patrol or the arresting officer.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Senator Lewis I checked into this as far as neighboring states here in the mid-west, Colorado, Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Oklahoma, South Dakota, and Wyoming have adopted the same rules of the road provision.

SENATOR LEWIS: But you have no criteria about what obstructing the drivers view or his condition of driving would be in the law, is that right?

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: This Senator Lewis would be, a judgment call on the patrol or the arresting officer, why they changed their opposition, I don't know, but they decided that they could live with the bill.

SENATOR LEWIS: It sounds pretty flexible to me, Senator Rasmussen. It is going to be very difficult to enforce, I would suspect.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? Question is the advancement of the bill. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 11 nays and 12 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. LB263.

CLERK: Read LB263

PRESIDENT: Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, and Senators. LB263 is a bill that was introduced with cooperation with the Motor Vehicle Department and it is part of their overall legislative program this year to bring their program into compliance and to coordinate it. Essentially the bill states that the revocation of a license should under the point law should be changed from one year to six months. This brings it in the same time limit as revocation for conviction of drunk driving or implied consent. You loose your license now because of drunk driving or complied consent or implied consent you loose it for a six months period. If you loose your license because of points, you loose your license for one year. It seems inconsistent to...as legislature adjudicated last year, it seems inconsistent that you would loose your license for six months for conviction of drunk driving and implied consent and a full year for points. I move the passage of this bill from General File to E & R initial.

CLERK: Mr. President, there is an amendment offered by Senator Duis. On page 2 line 13, strike everything after state through "course" in line 20, and show as stricken.

PRESIDENT: Senator Duis.
