bill and between the time that it gets from General File over to Select File, I would like for Emery Burnett or somebody down there to print up the bill in the exact form with the amendments applied to the bill, so we can see exactly what we have got when we get it to Select File. I have one more amendment that I would offer at that time but I'll talk this over with Barnett first, and then we will at least have a copy of the bill in complete form readable form, I might add, that we can see just what we are advancing.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature, I share Senator Kelly's concern about the penalties but, because of the other kinds of issues that were discussed for amending this morning, I thought that I would save my amendments, if any, until Select File. Because that is the only way we will find out what form the bill is in and what we will actually be amending. Now it takes the same number of votes to amend on General as on Select, so I'll talk to you about my concerns on Select File, and I would like to do something about them, and I'll tell you why. If a sexual assault occurs, I can not see so much difference in the quality of the act that one person would get one year and the other would get fifty. I don't see that much difference could occur in one act.

PRESIDENT: Are you ready for the vote to advance the bill? Record. Record the Vote Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 37 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. We move off of General File.
