PRESIDENT: Well Senator Warner was going to do that, but he didn't think he had time, then he . . .

SENATOR BARNETT: I'd like to make that motion.

PRESIDENT: Alright. Any discussion? The question is the advancement of 115. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced.

SPEAKER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. We have now the next series of bills where either the introducer or the chairman of the committee is not present, if there were committee amendments. So then we will take up 434 and 215.

PRESIDENT: 434, Senator . . . Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, LB 434 is a bill which was introduced by the Committee on Agriculture and Environment that had reference to prompt payment by retailers. The Legislature did pass, several days ago, a resolution which dealt with the same subject. At that time I told the body that if that resolution was advanced that I would ask that LB 434 be bracketed indefinitely. At this time I renew that request and would ask for your favorable consideration on a motion to bracket LB 434 indefinitely.

PRESIDENT: The question is shall LB 434 be bracketed indefinitely. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is bracketed. Mr. Clerk would you read 215.

CLERK: (mic inactivated) . . . has a motion on it and I don't believe is here this week. He's got a motion to bracket it. Read title of LB 215. Mr. President, there are committee amendments by Senator Anderson's Miscellaneous Subjects Committee.

SPEAKER: I checked with the introducer and he wasn't aware that there were committee amendments. I don't think we should discuss this bill. I do know Senator Duis and Senator Murphy are both here. We'll move then to 217.

PRESIDENT: You said 217, didn't you?

SPEAKER: Listen, if the vice chairman is here and he's capable of handling those amendments, fine. Let's proceed then.

PRESIDENT: Now what are we talking about?

SPEAKER: LB 215.
