PRESIDENT: Motion carries.

CLERK: Read title to LB 32.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hasebroock.

SENATOR HASEBROOCK: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I believe there's an amendment to the committee amendment to 32.

CLERK: There are committee amendments Mr. President.

SENATOR HASEBROOCK: I move that the committee amendments be adopted. The committee amendments, could I explain the committee amendments Mr. President?

PRESIDENT: Yes.

SENATOR HASEBROOCK: The amendments to LB 32 is to clear up an apparent inequity in the county employees retirement system. Legislation previously passed provided if a person were age 64 and retired he couldn't get his prior service benefits. However, no provision was made for the employee retired at age 65 or older. This is an apparent inequity that these persons are denied this portion of the benefits which they have earned that are granted to terminating members who are younger than age 65. This amendment would clarify these provisions for the persons age 65 or older. This is the purpose of the amendment. I move that the amendment be adopted.

PRESIDENT: Is there discussion of the motion? The question is the adoption of the committee amendments. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on motion to adopt the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: They are adopted.

CLERK: There are some further amendments, Mr. President, offered by Senator Hasebroock.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hasebroock.

SENATOR HASEBROOCK: Would you read the amendments.

CLERK: They're set out in full in the Journal on page 1222. They're those long ones.

SENATOR HASEBROOCK: I think these are some . . . that's the same amendments that I just talked about.

CLERK: Well that's different than the committee amendment.

SENATOR HASEBROOCK: Yeah, this was the committee amendment.

CLERK: The committee amendment did nothing more than say the act shall become operative in January 1, 1976.
